

A Remembrance Day Message from Mayor John Henderson



The poem "In Flanders Field" was written by Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae who served in the Second Battle of Ypres in Flanders, Belgium. He wasn't just a soldier; he was a poet, a physician, an author, an artist and a surgeon during World War I. His poignantly written piece memorialized his fallen comrade who died in

battle, and like countless others, was buried in a field where poppies grew with a white wooden cross as his only marker for his ultimate sacrifice. He and tens of thousands died so that we can live to the fullest, freely in this glorious country. Many more lived but came home broken and injured in mind and body.

This November 11th you will mark the day in your way – whether it is visiting the Cenotaph in Victoria Park to join in on Remembrance Day ceremonies, or observing a minute of silence privately, we will all solemnly remember the sacrifice of these men and women.

With our World War I veterans gone and our World War II veterans diminishing, we must remember to tell their stories and hold their sacrifices near to our hearts.

We are fortunate to live in Canada, a country whose beauty spans from coast-to-coast, amongst peaceful and patriotic people.
